COMMITTEE APPOINTED TO HANDLE X-RAY SURVEY

The Tuberculosis committee, Mrs. B. W. Barnes, presiding, made committee appointments to handle the promotion and education of the mass X-ray survey among the Negroes at a meeting of the group at Susie B. Dudley Y. W. C. A. Monday night, October 6. Miss Frances Kornegay, health educator of the State Board of Health, explained the X-ray survey to the group.

There will be four mobile X-ray units moving around over the city and county in an effort to X-ray every person over 15 years of age in the city and county. The X-ray units are owned by the State Board of Health. They will supply the doctor, technicians and supervising clerks. The scheduling, promotion and education is our local community obligation, Miss Kornegay said.

The opening date is November 17, and will continue until every person has had an opportunity to have a chest X-ray. Exact position of the units in the Negro sections will be announced by the Health Departments at a later date. The X-rays are free to everyone. There is no undressing. The obligations of the members

of the community is to see that every person knows about the X-ray, and why they should take advantage of the service. In this connection the following committees were appointed:

The mobile X-ray unit will be near everyone at some time during the survey. Watch for newspaper announcement and listen to the radio for schedules.

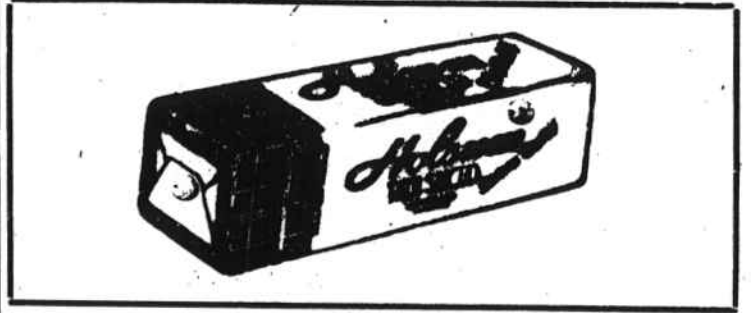
