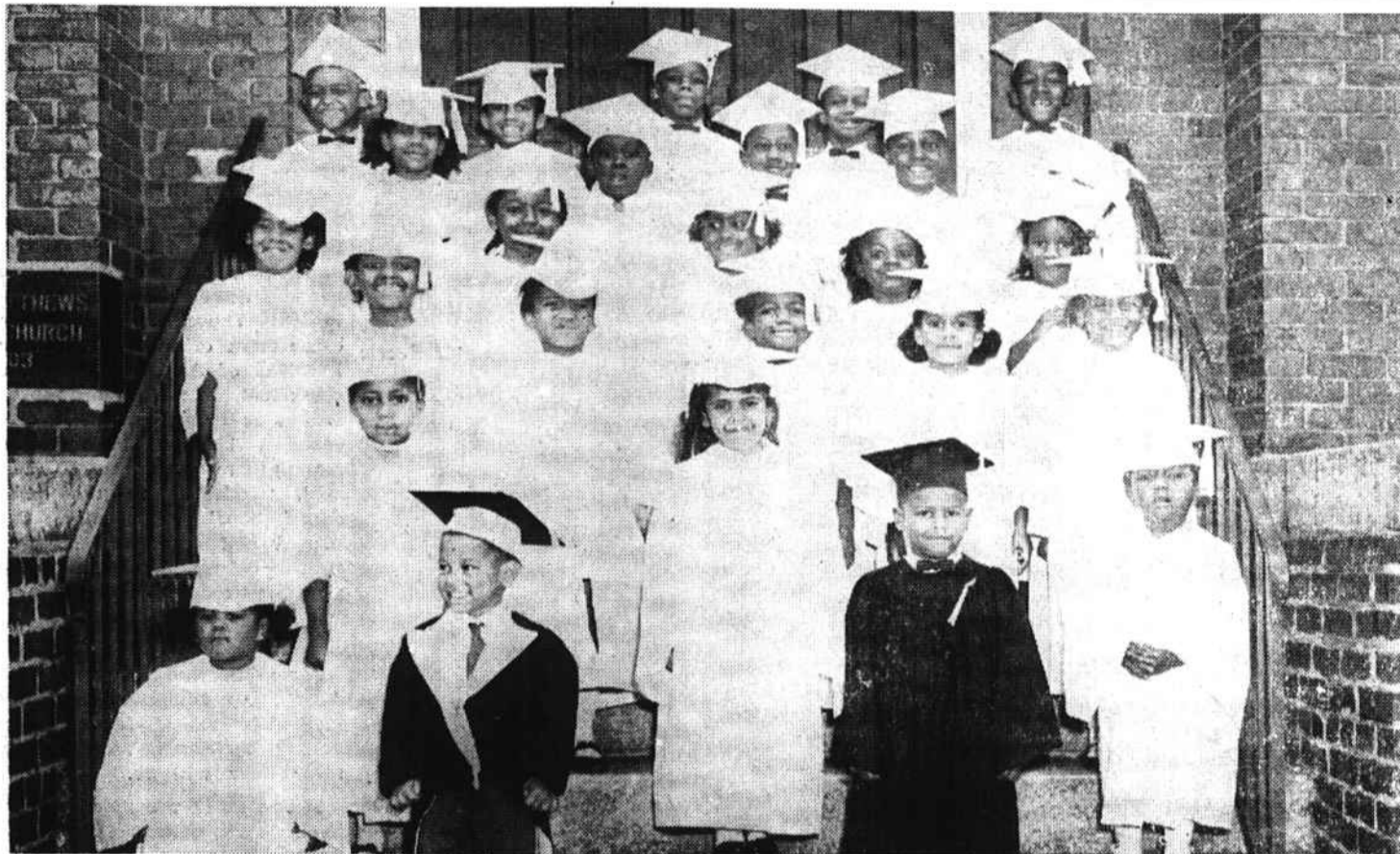

manded meat cuts in her stage presentations.

She will be in Greensboro, N. C. on May 23, at 2:30 p.m. to present a program "Avenues to Good Eating" for Bennett College students. And she is firmly convinced that these avenues lead to roads of good health.

Mrs. McSwain terms her demonstration "a short course in meat cookery" but she doesn't attempt to cover everything about meat from market to mealtime.
