The Rowan Baptist Convention To Be Held June 28-30

The Rowan Baptist Sunday Church School and the Rowan Baptist Training Union will meet in a convention, Wednesday thru Friday, June 28, 29, 30, 1967 with the First Baptist Church of Burlington, N. C. and Dr. H. J. Cobb as the host pastor. The theme of the Training Convention will be "Who Am I? What Am I?" This part of the convention will take place Wednesday and will include: an inspirational message by Rev. Leonard L. Macon, B.T.U. conferences and reports, and an annual sermon by Dr. K. O. P. Goodwin, pastor of the Mount Zion Baptist Church of Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

Thursday's program will be devoted to the Sunday School Convention with Mr. Jimmie Barber of A&T College, presiding. This program will include as keypoints: the inspirational message by Rev. J. C. W. Avery Jones Heads Winston Life Insurance Company; Succeeds Hill

WINSTON-SALEM, N. C. — W. Avery Jones, 76, a veteran lawyer, became the new president of Winston Mutual Life Insurance Company Thursday, June 15 as the result of an election by the Board of Directors.

He was a vice president and general counsel of Winston Mutual during the past 25 years. He succeeds the late Edward Everett Hill as president. Hill, who had held office 14 years, died suddenly of a heart attack Friday, June 9 at his home.

Rumor L. Oden, agency director for the past two years, was elected to the board to succeed Hill.

Jones heads a company that was founded nearly 61 years ago. Winston Mutual is valued at more than \$5,000,000 and has more than \$26,000,000 of insurance in force. It is one of only two Negro owned and operated insurance companies with home offices in the state of North Carolina.

In Jones Winston Mutual has its sixth president, a native of Pensacola, Fla. and a graduate of Florida A & M University and the Howard University Law School.

"I shall endeavor to carry on and to accelerate the progress of the company," Jones said as

he accepted his new office. "I hope to surround myself with people who have the know how to make this progress a reality."

He also expressed interest in the employment of a young lawyer to do his leg work and learn the legal machinery of the insurance company. "This is a great opportunity for a young man willing and eager to learn and ready for a chance to advance," he said.
