Eight Added To Staff At Bennett College

The addition of eight persons to the faculty and staff at Bennett College for the 1967-68 academic year was announced this week by President Isaac H. Miller, Jr.

Joining the faculty in English will be Nathaniel Gaylord of Burlington, North Carolina, and Harry Humes of Greensboro. Mr. Gaylord, formerly of the

Jordan-Sellers High School faculty, is a graduate of Shaw University, holds the M.A. degree from North Carolina College and is enrolled in the Ph.D program at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Mr. Humes, who last year taught part-time, is a graduate of Bloomsburg (Pa.) State College and holds the master of fine arts degree from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

Mrs. Burma Wilkins of Greensboro, who has been a member of the faculty of Dudley High School, comes to Bennett as instructor in social science. She holds the B.A. and M.A. from Howard University, Washington, D. C., and has done further study at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

Vernon L. Jackson, of Vienna, Md., a graduate of Morgan State College, with a master's degree from Atlanta University and further study at the University of Paris, will teach French as a National Teaching Fellow. Mrs. Hortensia Boudy, of Greensboro, with advanced degrees from the University of Havana, will teach Spanish.

Mrs. Barbara H. Bryan, who last year served as assistant librarian at Jackson (Miss.) State College and has served in the libraries at Morgan State College, Rust College and Dillard University, joins the library staff. A Bennett graduate with a M.S.L.S. degree from Syracuse University, Mrs. Bryan at one time taught library science courses here.

Also rejoining the faculty is Miss Julia Wilson who will teach accounting. A graduate of South Carolina State College with a M.B.S. degree from Atlanta University, Miss Wilson last year was at Fayetteville (N.C.) State College. Coming to the college for the second semester will be Dr. Ratanabal Arulanatham from the Women's Christian College of Madras to teach biochemistry under the United States-India Women's College Exchange Program. Holder of the Ph.D from Northwestern University, Dr. Arulanatham will spend the first semester at Mount Holyoke College.

TWO TEACHERS RECEIVE GRANTS FOR 1967-68
