According to an announcement today by Eugene Levette, Supervisor of Centers and Playgrounds, District 2 of the Greensboro Parks and Recreation Department, the Dudley High School gymnasium has been secured for use by the Recreation Department each Saturday from 9:00 a. m. - 1:00 p. m., beginning Saturday, November 25th to operate a basketball program for boys who desire to play with an organized league team.

Leagues will be organized for boys in the following age classifications: Pee Wee League is for boys 7-9 years old; Midget League for boys 10-12 years old and Jr. Teen League is for boys 13-15 years old.

Levette reported that we are elated over securing the use of the gymnasium until the completion of the New Windsor Community Center. This facility will give the boys in this area

somewhere to play basketball.

This program will be held every Saturday at Dudley High School gymnasium. Upon completion of the new Windsor Center this basketball program will be moved to the new Center gymnasium. The new Center will have adjustable basketball goals. This is why we are initiating a basketball program for boys 7-9 years for the first time Levette stated.

All boys are to bring T-shirt, shorts and tennis shoes. Kenneth A. Free, newly appointed Center Director of the new Windsor Center, will be in charge of this program.
