Dr. Henry Clayton Eccles, age 72, was born in Summerfield, N. C. on March 27, 1895 and departed this life on December 8, 1967 after an extended illness. He was the son of the late Pinkney L. Eccles and Mary Clark Eccles of High Point, North Carolina. Prior to moving to Greensboro at an early age, Dr. Eccles lived in High Point.

After completing the High Point Normal Industrial School and Bennett College in Greensboro, Dr. Eccles enrolled in the

school of Pharmacy at Howard University where he received a degree in Pharmacy. Since that time he has served for thirty-two years as a pharmacist in New York City, Hampton, Va. and Greensboro, N. C.

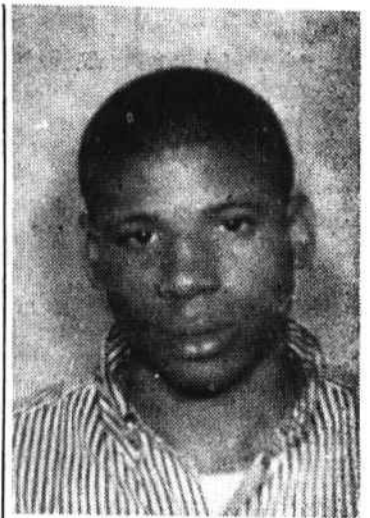
Cotten, 21, a native of Portsmouth, died after receiving stab wounds inflicted by a 20-year old Greensboro youth.

The wounding occurred on an outside basketball court of a local YMCA where Cotten had gone to play after classes. He was pronounced dead at the University Infirmary.

Police are continuing a search for a man identified as Ralph Eugene Oliver, wanted in connection with the slaying. Police said he is not a student at A&T.

Cotten participated in football and track at I. C. Norcom High School. He was on the track team one year at A&T.
