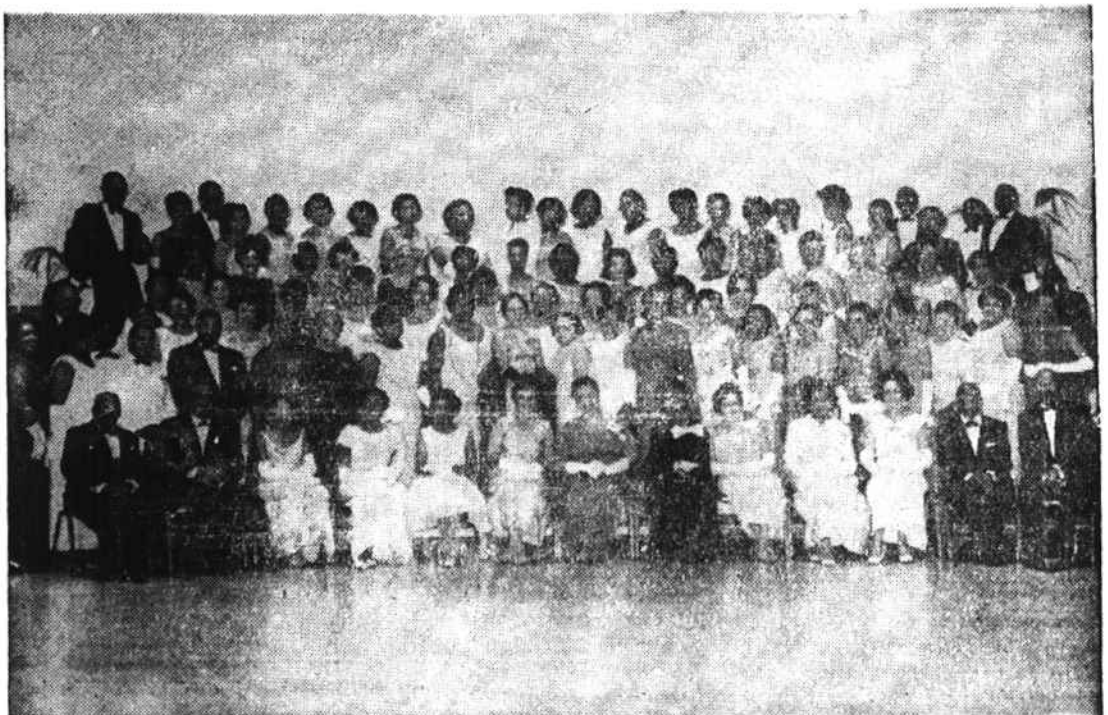
The morning session will be addressed by Dr. George Grill, assistant professor of business and secretarial administration at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.
