DR. S. E. DUNCAN, PRESIDENT **OF LIVINGSTONE COLLEGE DIES**

SALISBURY (AP)-Dr. Samuel E. Duncan, president of Livingtone College in Salisbury since 1958, died Wednesday afternoon after becoming ill at his

Dr. Duncan was pronounced dead on arrival at Rowan Memorial Hospital. He had suffered two illnesses in 1967.

In 1957, he was elected president of the North Carolina Council of Churches, becoming member of the North Carolina

3 Administrative Deans Appointed At A.&T. By RICHARD MOORE A&T News Bureau

The appointment of three new deans and the creation of a new School of Arts and Sciences were announced Wednesday at A&T State University.

Dr. Lewis C. Dowdy, president of A&T, said that Dr. Reginald Amory had been named dean of the School of Engineering, Dr. Jewellean S. Mangaroo had been named Dean of the School of Nursing and Dr. Arthur F. Jackson would be dean of the newly created School of Arts and Sciences.

The appointments are effectively immediately, except that of Dr. Mangaroo. She will assume her position on February 1. Her predecessor, Mrs. Naomi Wynn will remain until February as dean and then return to fulltime teaching as a professor of nursing.

Dr. Dowdy also announced that Dr. Walter C. Daniel, chairman of the English Department, has been appointed chairman of the new Division of Humanities.
