(Editor's Note: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.)

Q-When I get out of service I'll still have to finish high school. Would it be smart for me not to use my G. I. Bill education and training entitlement while completing high school so that I can have all of it available for college?

A-There is no need to "save" your entitlement for college. Last year Congress passed a law permitting veterans to receive an educational assistance allowance (\$130 a month for a single veteran in full-time training) from the Veterans Administration while completing high school. This allowance will not be charged against your full Mayodan City School Board. entitlement to college level training under the G. I. Bill.

Q-Can I buy a particular house I would like under the G. I. loan program-even though the seller insists on getting more than the VA appraisal price?

A-Yes, you may, provided that you are willing to pay in cash the difference between the amount on the Veterans Administration Certificate of Appraisal and the actual selling price of the house.

Q-I would like very much to serve as a volunteer in a VA hospital but my free time is limited to a couple of hours during the middle of the day. Is there a need for volunteer help during these odd hours?

A-There certainly is. The Veterans Administration Voluntary Service can use help just about any hour of the day, any day of the week, generally between 9:00 a. m. and 9:00 p. m. There are all kinds of jobs to be done. Check with your local VA hospital. Your interest and assistance will be most appreci-
