

NEW PERSONNEL, INCREASE IN FEES APPROVED BY A&T BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Authorization for the employment of a community relations specialist and approval for an increase in tuition were principal actions taken at a meeting of the A&T State University board of trustees here last week.

Tuition for out-of-state students at A&T State University will increase next fall from the present level of \$750 to \$950, according to a resolution adopted by the Board.

The \$200 boost was authorized by the last session of the General Assembly.

The authorized increase for students whose legal residence is in North Carolina was \$50, and this too was approved by the trustees. The current in-state rate of \$201 will thus be increased to \$251.

Dr. L. C. Dowdy, president of A&T, reported to the board that the university will employ a full-time community relations specialist next July.

He will report directly to the president and represent the university in affairs that relate to the community at large in efforts to eliminate gaps of misunderstanding between town and gown, said Dowdy.

The specialist will also serve as an adviser to students whose

interests and activities may involve the city.

Dowdy said the community relations program of the university would be extended vigorously with expectation of making resources of the university well known in Greensboro.

The first year's program will be financed with \$22,682 made available through the State Board of Higher Education from the federal government.

Dowdy also announced that the University will receive funds from the Board of Higher Education to add an assistant to the president. He named three administrative officers.

Jonah Smith was appointed bursar, James Garfield, director of auxiliary services; and Edward Billups, chief accountant.

FIRST BLACK WINS LICENSE AS PSYCHOLOGIST IN NORTH CAROLINA

Mrs. Hattie H. Liston, Assistant Professor of Psychology at A&T State University, was informed recently that her application for licensure as a practicing psychologist has been approved by the North Carolina State Board of Examiners of Practicing Psychologists.

Mrs. Liston is the only Black woman approved to be practicing

psychologist in the state of North Carolina.

The licensure for the practice of Psychology requires the Ph.D. degree and an oral examination. However, under a grandfather clause ending July 1, 1969, Mrs. Liston qualified for the licensure. Her continuing endeavors in graduate study far above the master's degree level, her qualifications, services, and abilities and her recommendations and merit allowed the oral examination and Ph.D. degree to be waived.

During the years Mrs. Liston has received numerous honors and distinctions. She is the author of a booklet, "How to Study and Learn," that has been used widely in senior high schools, at this university, at Hampton Institute, at North Carolina Central University, Palmer Institute, at Morris College, and other institutions. She is listed in Who's Who Among

American Women, 1966-1967, 1967-1968; Who's Who of American World Notables 1970-1971; Who's Who in the South, Southwest and Mexico 1969-1970, Royal Blue Book of England, 1969; Dictionary of International Biography, London England 1966; and Certified Adviser.

She was a member of the Marquis and the Biographical Library Society, 1969. She was also elected to the National Social Register, New York, 1967 and the National Register of Prominent Americans, 1968.

Mrs. Liston belongs to a number of professional organizations. She is the mother of two daughters. The youngest, a high school senior, is a National Merit Scholarship winner and is profiled in Who's Who Among High School Seniors for 1970.
