Veterans' Corner

Editor's Note: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q — When I married my husband, a World War II veteran, I had two children who became his stepchildren. We were married only five months before his death. Would I be eligible for a VA pension, and if not, would the children be eligible?

A — You, as a widow, would not be eligible for a pension. But if the stepchildren were living with you and your husband, they would be eligible to receive VA benefits. We suggest you contact your nearest VA office.

Q — I frequently see VA repossessed homes advertised for sale. Are these sales limited to veterans?

A — No. Anyone who qualifies may purchase these homes — veterans or non-veterans.

Q — My husband receives a VA pension, and has to have someone with him constantly. Can his pension be increased to pay for this assistance?

A — Veterans who receive pension, and who become so helpless as to need regular aid and attendance of another person, may be eligible for an additional allowance. Apply at your nearest VA office.

Q — What are the VA regulations for servicemen who want to take correspondence courses?

A — Currently, servicemen must have been on active duty for at least two years, with a period of at least 181 days continuous service. Also, the correspondence course must be approved by the state approving agency and lead to an identified educational or professional objective.

HOLD MEDICARE BILLS

"When should I submit my doctor bills to Medicare? This is a question asked many times each week," said Charles H. Myers, Manager of the Greensboro Social Security Office.

According to Myers, bills may be sent in for payment any time a Medicare beneficiary wishes to send them, but not later than December 31 of the year following the year in which the medical services are rendered. For example, any bills incurred during 1970 may be sent in by December 31, 1971.

"The Prudential Insurance Co. in High Point, N. C., which handles the medical insurance part of Medicare, has told us that about 30 percent of the claims they receive cannot be paid because the beneficiary's \$50 deductible for the year has not been met. Therefore, I

The four persons in the car which went out of control and jumped the median, causing the head-on crash, were all killed. Mr. Simpson and four other children were injured.

Janice Lynette Simpson, born July 21, 1962, was a third grade student at the Washington St. Elementary School.

GUNSHOT DEATH CHARGE FACING LOCAL WOMAN

Clyde Hope, 43, of 1314 Bluford St. was shot with a .38 caliber pistol Monday afternoon at 222-A Bingham St. and died almost instantly.

Angela Rogers, 21, of 919 Bluford St. was charged with murder and is being held in Guilford County jail without bond.

Police found Hope on the kitchen floor with a bullet hole in his chest shortly after he was shot at approximately 2:00 p.m. He was dead on arrival at Cone Hospital, according to Dr. Allan Coggeshall, Guilford County Medical Examiner.

The body is at Brown's Funeral Home, where the family received their friends on Thursday evening from 7-9.

A&T Asks State For \$11,000,000 In Funds; Pre-School Lab, Health Building Priorities

Officials at A&T State University Tuesday asked the North Carolina Advisory Budget Commission for \$11,219,000 for capital improvements for the next two years.

In making the A&T presentation to the board, Dr. Glenn F. Rankin, dean of academic affairs said major facilities needed by the University include a \$3½ million health and physical education building, a half-million dollar pre-school laboratory, and \$345,000 for a warehouse and maintenance shop.

"All of these are priority facilities," said Rankin. "We have made both of these requests during the past two or three state budget hearings."

Rankin said the pre-school laboratory facility will be used to provide laboratory experiences for students majoring in child development, home economics education, psychology and special education. The University also plans to operate a developmental research center.

The health and physical edu-
