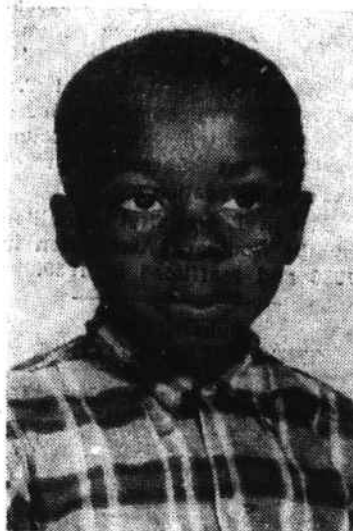


FUTURE OUTLOOK STAR SALESMEN
