## Rucker Rites Held Wednesday, January 6th

Funeral for Pierce C. Rucker, 87, founder of several Greensboro businesses and a retired director of Jefferson Pilot Corp., were held at 11 a.m. Wednesday at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, with burial in Green Hill Cemetery. Mr. Rucker died Monday night of heart failure at Moses Cone Hospital.

A native of Columbia, S. C., he founded South Atlantic Bonded Warehouse Corp., the Rucker Wholesale Co. and Rucker Cold Storage Co., businesses in which he was active until two weeks ago.

A Greensboro resident for 63 years, he lived at 303 Wentworth Dr. He had been a director of Jefferson Standard Life Insurance Co. for 40 years before becoming a Jefferson Pilot Director with the company's name and organizational change.

Mr. Rucker was a past member of the board of trustees of then A. and T. State College and a former chairman of the Democratic Party in Guilford County.

He was a charter member of the Greensboro Rotary Club, founder of Carolina Maytag Corp. of Greensboro, past president of the Greensboro Country Club, and president of the Lewis Society of Virginia.

The active civic and business leader was a charter member
