Record \$149,000 Assets Listed By Federal Credit Union At A&T

Record assets of more than \$149,083 were reported to shareholders of the Educational Workers Federal Credit Union at A&T State University here this week.

In his annual report to the group, Latham Wallace, secretary-treasurer, said assets on hand at the end of 1970 totaled \$149,083.45, an increase of more than \$23,000 over last year's assets.

Wallace also noted that loans totaling more than \$162,837.07 were processed by the credit

union in 1970. This was also a record.

In other business, a dividend of five per cent was voted on all shares and the following officers were re-elected: Dr. W. L. Kennedy, president; Dr. W. T. Gibbs, Sr., vice president; Mr. J. M. Marteen, Mr. J. C. McLaughlin, Dr. Dorothy Prince, and Latham Wallace, secretary-treasurer.

A&T's credit union was chartered on Feb. 3, 1938, and is the only federally chartered credit union affiliated with a state institution in North Carolina.

Alumni Support For A&T State U. Reaches \$100,000 Over Two-Years

Alumni support for A&T State University during the past two years amounted to \$100,000 in scholarships, according to the bi-annual report of the A&T Foundation released last Wednesday.

Dr. Lewis C. Dowdy, president of A&T, called the increasing alumni support, "one of the most encouraging aspects of the (Continued on Page 8)

Veterans' Corner

Editor's Note: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q — Are widows of World War II veterans who died on active duty or from service-connected disabilities still eligible for GI home loans?

A — Yes. Unused, expired entitlement for widows of World War II veterans, as well as for veterans themselves, was revived by recent legislation.

Q — My husband has a total and permanent disability from a service-connected injury. Can my children be recipients of VA educational assistance?

A — It is likely that you and your children are eligible for assistance to wives and children of deceased or totally and permanently disabled veterans. Apply to your nearest VA office.

Q — I am eligible for training under the VA vocational rehabilitation program. Is it possible for me to take part-time training under the program?

A — Yes. This has been possible since July 26, 1968.

Q — I am a Vietnam veteran discharged May 2, 1967, attending school under the GI Bill. Does this bar me from the home loan benefit?

A — No. The availability of the home loan benefit is not affected by the education benefit in any manner whatsoever.
