SENIOR MIKE GALE SHOWS WHY HE IS A PRIME PRO PROSPECT --

Senior forward Mike Gale of Elizabeth City State scored 34 points last Saturday to help the Vikings down nationally ranked North Carolina A&T. That made his coach, Bobby Vaughan very happy.

But Vaughan was quick to add, "If Gale were only a scorer, we would be in real trouble. He is averaging 19 rebounds per game and is also our best passer."

For his outstanding efforts in the Vikings latest two games, Gale has been named the "CIAA Player of the Week."

Gale, a native of Philadelphia, is only 6-3½, but the coaches around the conference regard him as the league's prime pro prospect this season.

"Because our team is so short," added Vaughan, "we have to play Gale as a guard-forward. He has the making of a fine guard in the pros."

In his final season with the Vikings, Gale is averaging 23 points per game. His passing is something else to watch.

"He is a consistent performer," said Vaughan. "We think he

is the best ball player in the CIAA."

By beating the Aggies (11-3), Elizabeth City (11-4) remains in contention for the Southern Division title. A down-to-the wire finish may have to determine the final two tournament berths as Shaw (9-5), North Carolina Central (8-5), Johnson C. Smith (7-7) and Winston-Salem State (7-7) all have key games coming up this week.

In the Northern Division, both unbeaten Norfolk State (15-0) and strong Howard University have already clinched berths in the tournament which gets underway in Greensboro Feb. 25.

The University of Maryland—Eastern Shore (8-5) has moved into third place with Virginia Union in fourth place with a 7-7 mark and Morgan and Virginia State deadlocked in fifth place with 6-8 records.

A key game will take place in Raleigh Wednesday when A&T meets Shaw.
