Editor's Note: Veterans and period that I will have to apply

A - No. The one year allowabled veterans insurance begins with the date of the first notice of disability rating sent to you by VA after discharge.

Q - Are there any income and credit requirements a veteran must meet in obtaining a VA loan for a mobile home?

A - No, there is no set income requirement. The terms of repayment of the loan, however, must bear a proper relationship to the veteran's or serviceman's present and anticipated income and expenses, and he must be a satisfactory credit risk.

Q - May a veteran who is receiving compensation from the VA arrange to pay a policy loan on his National Service Life Insurance out of this monthly benefit?

A - Yes. It is a most convenient and relatively painless way to accomplish this repayment. VA Form 29-888, Insurance Deduction Authorization, available from any VA office, to the office which has your insurance records.

Q - Does the VA provide any educational program for veterans disabled in military service?
