LOCAL RESIDENT VICTIM OF AUTO CRASH DURING RAIN STORM

Mrs. Shirley Jean Williams Watlington, age 23 of 510 Craig St., was pronounced dead upon arrival at Moses H. Cone Memorial Hospital, Wednesday, June 16, 1971 from injuries she received in an automobile accident when the car she was driving leaped the median from the northbound lane of U.S. 29 and was struck broadside by a truck traveling in the opposite direction. The accident occurred about 2:35 p.m. during a driving rainstorm and the vehicles traveled 188 feet after impact.

The dead woman had to be

freed from the wreckage by attendants from the Guilford County Rescue Squad. Fire units were on hand at the scene.

Funeral services were held Saturday, June 19, 1971 at 4:00 p.m. from Middle Fort Christian Church, in Winston-Salem, N. C. with Rev. William Elder officiating. Burial was in Piedmont Memorial Park in Greensboro, N. C.
