

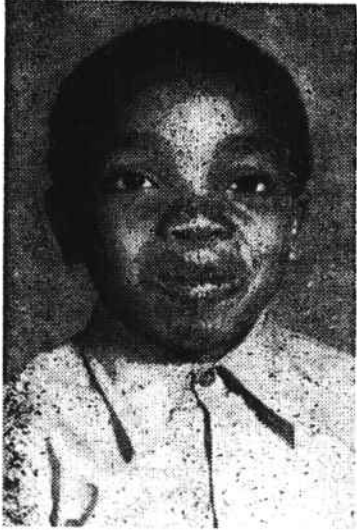

DEATHS AND FUNERALS BICYCLE AND TRUCK COLLISION KILLS 8-YEAR-OLD BOY

in Chapel Hill, N. C. The eight year old boy was struck by a truck while crossing a street on his bicycle on Saturday, Jan. 8 and was dead on arrival at Moses Cone Hospital.

According to Greensboro police reports, the accident occurred about 10:35 a.m. on Arlington Street at the intersection with East Whittington.

The truck, traveling south, driven by Curtis Walter Stephens of Browns Summit, had just crossed through the intersection when it struck the Newman boy crossing Arlington Street on his bicycle, reports said.

Police indicated that Stephens was driving his truck at about 25 miles per hour in the 35-mile-per-hour zone. There were no charges filed in the accident.

Survivors in addition to the parents are sisters, Mattie Lee and Althea Newman and brother, Jessie Ray Newman, all of the home; maternal grandmother and stepgrandfather, Mr. and Mrs. Woodrow McRay of Greensboro; aunts and uncles and a host of other relatives and friends.

Shaw University Board Member Pledges \$25,000; \$5,000 Been Paid
