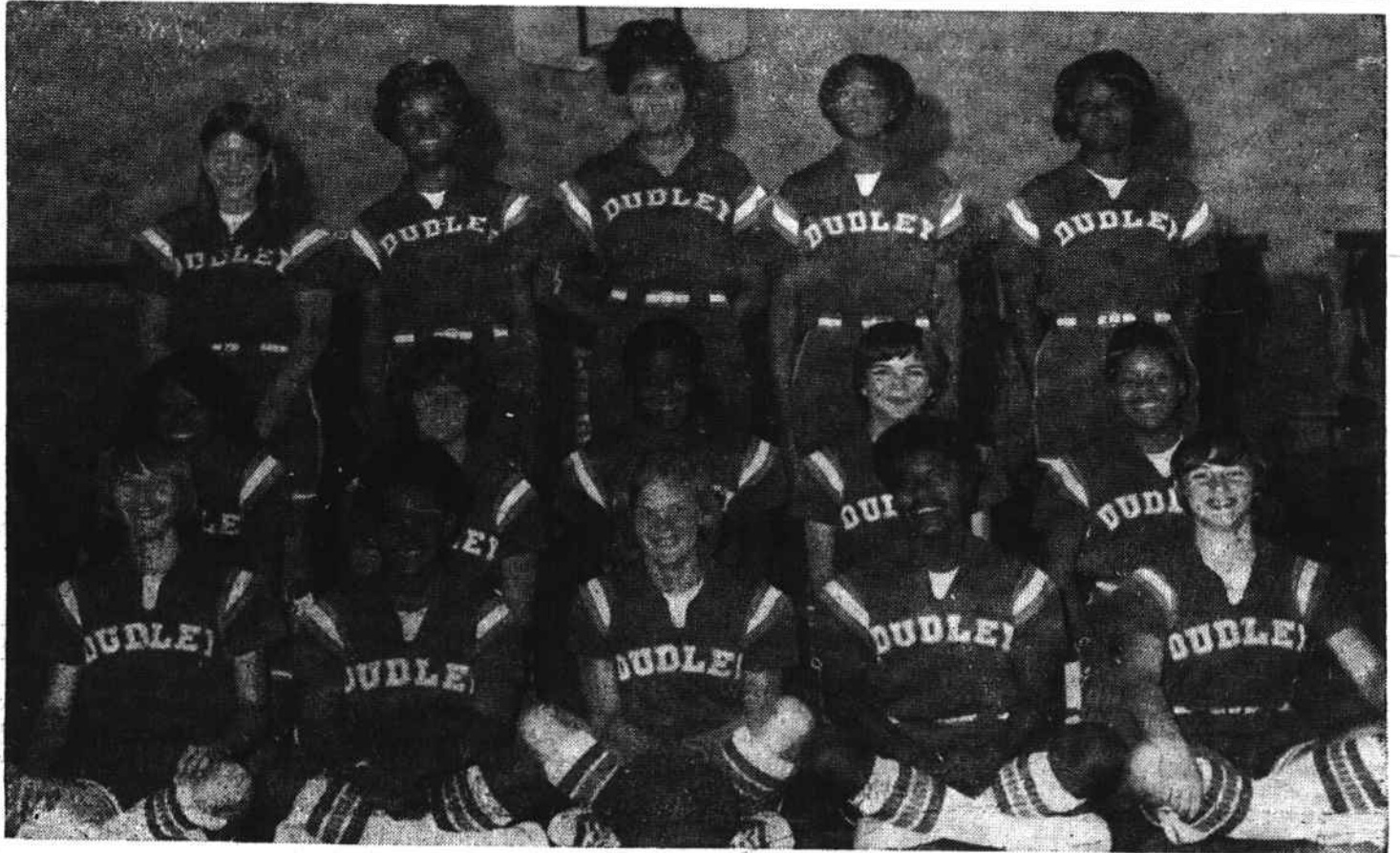
## UNION OF CHURCHES TO CELEBRATE 7TH ANNIVERSARY

The Dudley girls recorded a 8-2 conference record and a 10-3 overall record. The girls were undefeated on their home court.

The team is led by co-captains Verlyn Lowery and Lynn Myers. Jan Bridges is the leading scorer, averaging 14 points a game. Doris Wall is the leading rebounder. ## MEDICARE 'CARRY-OVER' PROVISION IS EXPLAINED

Doctor bills for October, November, and December may in some cases be counted toward the \$50 annual deductible for both 1971 and 1972 under the "carry-over" provision of the medical insurance part of Medicare, according to Charles H. Myers, Social Security District Manager in Greensboro.

The deductible is the first \$50 of covered medical expenses accumulated in a calendar year, Myers said.

"Before any payment can be made by Medicare," he said, "your record must show that you have met your deductible. So, as soon as your bills come to \$50, attach them to a request

for Medicare payment form, and send them to the carrier that handles your Medicare claims."

The "carry-over" rule helps the beneficiary who might otherwise have to pay the \$50 deductible twice in a short period of time — at the end of one year and at the beginning of the next year, Myers said.

"Even if you have not met the \$50 deductible before October," he said, "be sure to send in all the bills for covered services you received in October, November, or December. They can help meet the deductible for 1972."

## CIAA TOURNEY TO BE PLAYED AT GREENSBORO COLISEUM FEB. 24-26

Richmond, Va. — Norfolk State College, which clinched the Northern Division title of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) will play the number four team in the Southern Division in the opening round of the CIAA tournament.

The eight-team event will be played in the Greensboro Coliseum Thursday, Friday and Saturday, February 24-26 in Greensboro.

Conference Commissioner L.

D. Smith said that the second place team in the Northern Division will take on the third place in the Southern Division and the third place team in the Northern Division will; take on the second place team in the Southern race. The Southern Division winner will play the fourth place team in the Northern Division.

Actual team seedings will be announced after the CIAA Basketball Tournament Committee (Continued on Page 5)
