According to Dr. Bell, the list includes for the first time, to the best of anyone's knowledge, a member institution's chief administrator, Chancellor Charles "A" Lyons, Jr., Fayetteville State University.

Acting Commissioner L. D. Smith is the chairman of the panel and it includes Dr. Jack Brayboy, Johnson C. Smith University; C. E. Gaines, Winston-Salem State University; J. E. Lytle, Shaw University and Joseph Thompson, Saint Paul's College.

Ex-officio members include Dr. William Bell, S. M. Perkins, Secretary-Treasurer, CIAA; and Perry R. Leazer, Director CIAA Service Bureau.

The 1973 CIAA Basketball Tournament will be held Feb. 22-23 and 24 at the Greensboro Coliseum and four big sessions are planned for the many fans

who will be attending.

Norfolk State College is the defending CIAA Tourney Champ, nipping Fayetteville State University in the 1972 finals.

The Basketball Tournament Committee is the arm of the CIAA charged with the overall planning and operation of the basketball tournament. This committee's work has earned the three day session the distinction as the most successful indoor sports extravaganza sponsored by blacks anywhere in this nation.

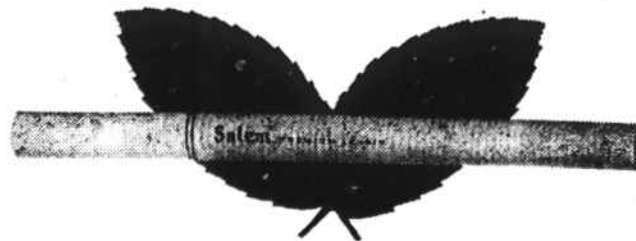
