Put A Dollar To Work

A dollar spent now for the construction or maintenance of property is in for a very busy time.

It enters the pocket of the workman on the job. It goes to the local dealer who sells the supplies and materials. It passes through the hands of the transportation companies that brings them to you. It visits the related concerns selling raw materials and basic supplies. Is It Economy?

The Board of County Commissioners have safe-guarded the county affairs and we have a county government second to none. For this fact we are not only proud of our noble board but we stand ready to co-operate in every way with their ideas of county government, but the question of using the old walls of the court house to tie a new wall to in the construction of a new building, does not seem to us as being the economical thing to do.

Of course, the board has been advised by one of the best architects in the State that the walls are sound enough to tie the new walls to and the advice of this architect should be worth far more than the advise of one who is not experienced in this particular line.

We base our ideas on the fact that the heat from the interior of the building could cause the inside portion of the walls to become so hot that the expansion would break all bonds with the outer portion of the walls and probably leave the outer wall in perfect shape but with only the strength of the outer layer of brick and that since the inner bonds have been broken, the present walls will not be sufficient to hold the weight of the building. At least, where the new walls will be tied to the old, it will leave a very bad appearance if the advice of the architect is true.

We are inclined to believe that for a few dollars more a new court house from the foundation up would suit those who are going to be taxed to pay the bill, better than take chances on the old walls and in the end everyone would be better satisfied.

The question that we would like to bring to the minds of the tax payers and citizens of Alleghany county is, "Is it Economical to use these walls?"
