GENTRY-STANLEY

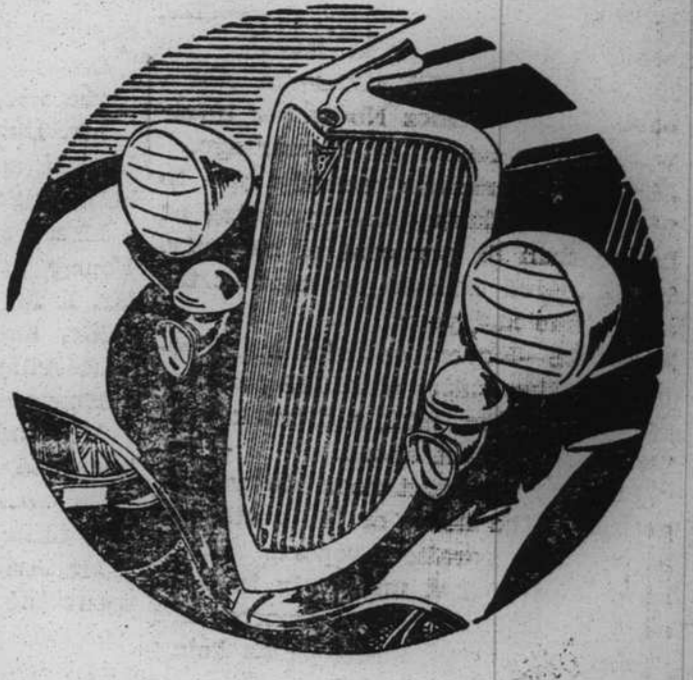
