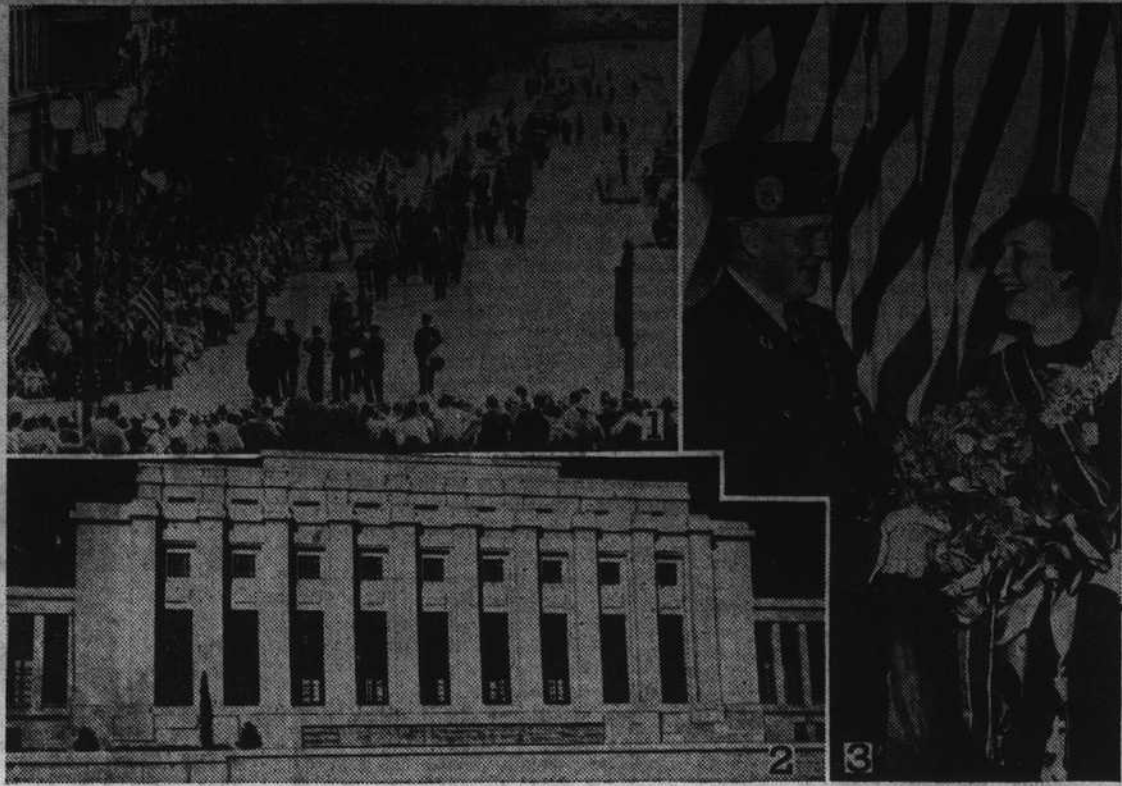


British Reds Demanding Aid for Spain

MAYORESS FROM CHILE



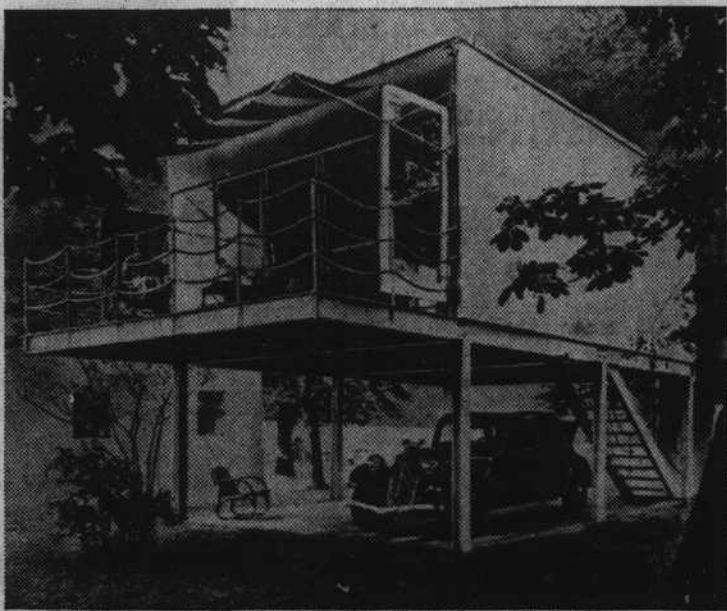

CHINESE GIRL WINS



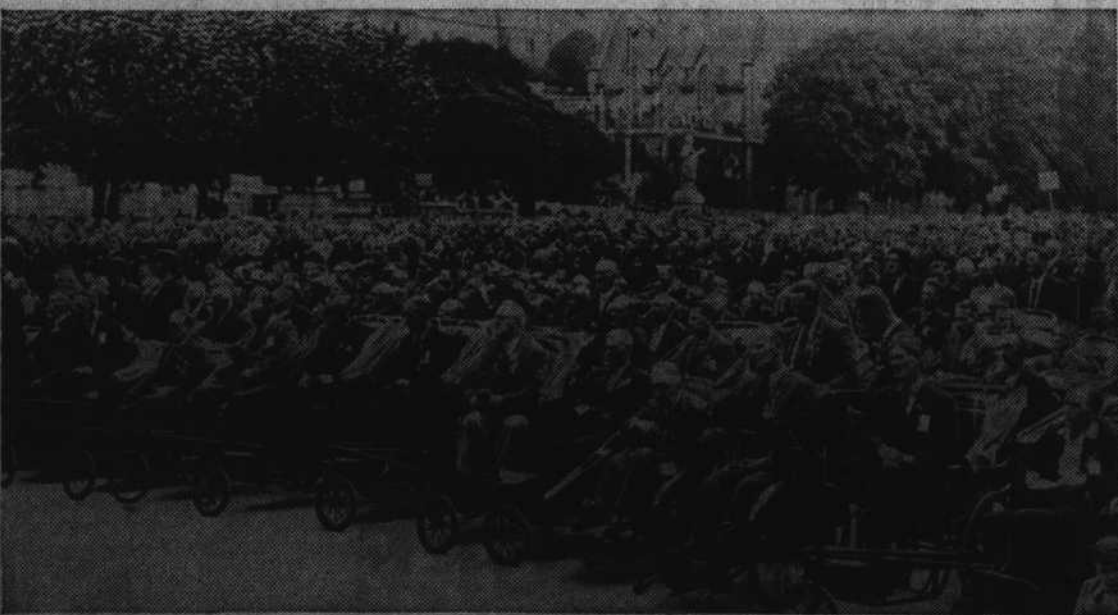
Little Gem Hoang, of China, proved herself a sensation at the girl's junior lawn tennis championship tournament at Wimbledon.
