#### TIN MINING OPERATIONS RESUMED AT KINGS MTN.

Young Geo. S. Groves, Representing a Million Dollar Corporation, Has Taken Over the Old Foster Property and is Planning a Most Successful Mining Business.

The the mines of Kings Mountain have again opened. The opera-tions are to be extensive, and a great amount of money spent which will prov to this country that the Carolina belt, being the only tin outside of Alaska in the United States, is among the richest in the world. The mines will be operated by the Groves Mining Corporation. The company being capitalized at a million dollars will take over the old Foster property, consisting of approximately four hundred and fifty acres of mining property, and includes the old milling plant in the town limits. The same property is now being held and wined by Geo. S. Groves, of Alexandria, Virginia, Mt. I.da. Mr. Groves is twonty three years of age. He has been opening up the placer and deeper shaft for some time.
