FARM QUESTIONS ANSWERED
 Q. Is there a limit to the soil-building payments on any farm?
 A. Yes. This payment cannot exceed an amount arrived at by multiplying by \$1.00 the total acres of soil conserving and soil building crops on the farm in 1936. However,

where there are less than 10 acres as the minimum requirement on the farm the payment may be as much as \$10.00. This minimum is 15 percent of the general soil-depleting base, and 20 percent of the cotton, tobacco, and peanut base as established.

Q. What causes double yolked eggs and is it possible to hatch two chicks from such an egg?
 A. Double yolked eggs are caused when two yolks ripen and drop into the ovarian pocket about the same time. Albumen is then formed about the two yolks and the result is a double yolked egg. Such eggs are generally discarded when selecting eggs for hatching and no instance has been recorded where such an egg produced two chicks. Despite the size of the egg, it is hardly possible that there is sufficient space in the egg for the normal development of two chicks.
