Gaston County Fair News

Gastonia, N. C., Oct. 12 .- According to Francis Whiteside, Secretary of the Gaston County Fair, things are lining up nicely in his preparation for the big event.

Premium lists have been mailed to the farmers of the county, and a great deal of interest is being shown throughout this section generally.

This year there is quite an increase in the number of premiums to be awarded, as well as in the size of some of them. The premuim booklet carries a complete list of these wards, along with the rules governing the presentation of them, entrance requirements, etc.

The fair office, located at 266-270 West Main street, announces that the checks for these premiums have already been written, and are ready to be filled in with the winners' names. These checks total in excess of \$2,000, which fact should increase the number of contributors to the various departments.

One big change has been made re garding entries made in the Live Stock department. Heretofore, only 4-H Club members were permitted to enter swine as exhibits, but thiis year anyone may do so. Of course, only residents of Gaston County can win prizes, in any department, despite the fact that others may have exhibits in the fair.

Poultry diseases have just about died out in Union County for the present time, and farmers report good production on laying flocks.

Randolph County has set a new record for lespedeza plantings this year, with farmers seeding 40,000 Deres.
