Farm Kitchens Have Their Faces Lifted

Three hundred and twenty six North Carolina farm home kitchens are having "their faces lifted" in a contest sponsored by home demonstration workers of the State College extension service.

Commenting on the contest, Ruth Current, state home agent, said: "Those dark, dusty grab-all, hide-away pantries and cupboards are going to be done away with or else be given more light and made usable.

"These kitchens are going to be attractive with soft, pleasing walls painted in green, yellow, or ivory with touches of red, blue, yellow, or orange—also, 'the workshop efficient' they will be."

A efficient kitchen, she said, requires a separate working surface for each kind of work to be done, the arrangement of large equipment in step-saving sequences, that working surfaces be close together, that equipment be at a convenient height, and that small equipment be grouped around the center where it is first used.

Finding the correct height for working surfaces, so that women can work without stooping or unnecessarily straining their bodies, is of utmost importance, she continued.

To find this height, she said, stand erect, rest the arm comfortably against the body, and bend the elbow at a right angle. Then measure the distance from elbow to floor, and subtract eight inches to get proper height for working surfaces.

Again, stand erect. Place hands palm down at a comfortable height on an imaginary table. If this distance from the floor differs with that obtained from the first measurement, divided the difference.

Brief News Items

Mitchell county farmers have ordered and used over 800 tons of ground limestone this fall. Increased acre yields of corn are recorded this season largely as a result of the soil improvement work started last year.

Eight pigs fed by Carey Dudley, Kinston, route 4, netted him a labor profit of \$61.71 in a 4-H project. Carey fed the pigs a balanced ration for 124 days.

Jones County 4-H club boys, planning to grow corn next season, have planted more than 30 acres of winter legumes as cover crops for the acres to be seeded to corn.

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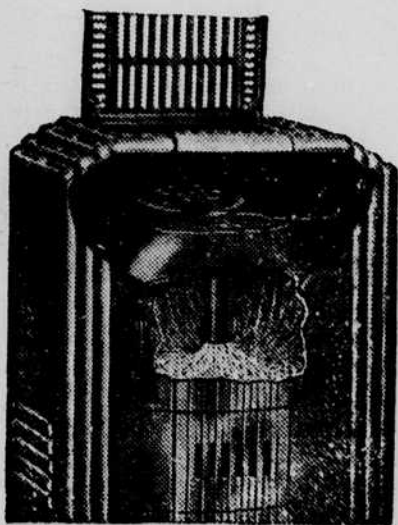
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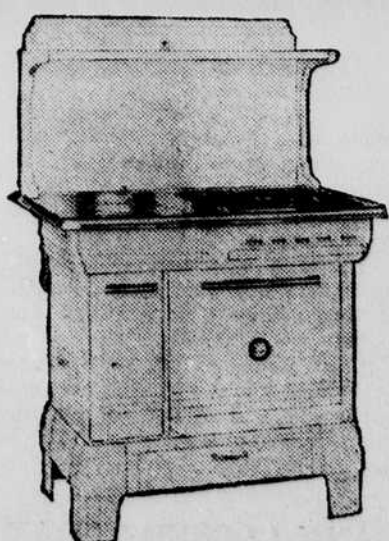
