

County Scouters Meet Here Friday

A Cleveland County Scouters Council is called for all local organizations, troop committees and Scoutmasters to meet in Kings Mountain at the Woman's Club Building, Friday, June 10, at 7:30 P. M.

Supper for the occasion is to be served by the Woman's Club and all local Boy Scout Chairmen, committeemen and Scoutmasters are being urged to send in immediately their reservations to W. K. Mauney, local Chairman or to Aubrey Mauney, Cleveland County Vice-President of the Piedmont Council.

The meeting is called by Aubrey Mauney for the purpose of hearing

reports on activities in the area and to form a county organization as recommended by the Piedmont Council. Shelby has just completed a drive for funds for the Council and report the campaign a great success. The amount which they had raised previously was just a little over \$1,000 but this year they have gone over the top by raising over \$1500.

The drive for funds in Kings Mountain is in charge of Charlie F. Thomason, J. H. Thomon and C. G. White. They are just now in process of their campaign and reports are that they will have the amount which the Piedmont Council is expecting of the community. The Council budget is based upon six dollars per Boy Scout. On this basis Kings Mountain's part would be approximately \$900. However the Council is taking special consideration of the fact that conditions are not so good in the community with our industries and are not

expecting this amount. The amount which Kings Mountain has been paying into the Council each year has been around \$500. More than this amount is reported now in sight.

A group of Scout leaders from here are planning to attend a leaders overnight camp at the Piedmont Boy Scout Camp at Lake Lanier near Tryon. They are to go Saturday afternoon and return Sunday afternoon.

A group of about fifty Kings Mountain Boy Scouts are expected at the camp from three of the local troops on the week of June 27th.

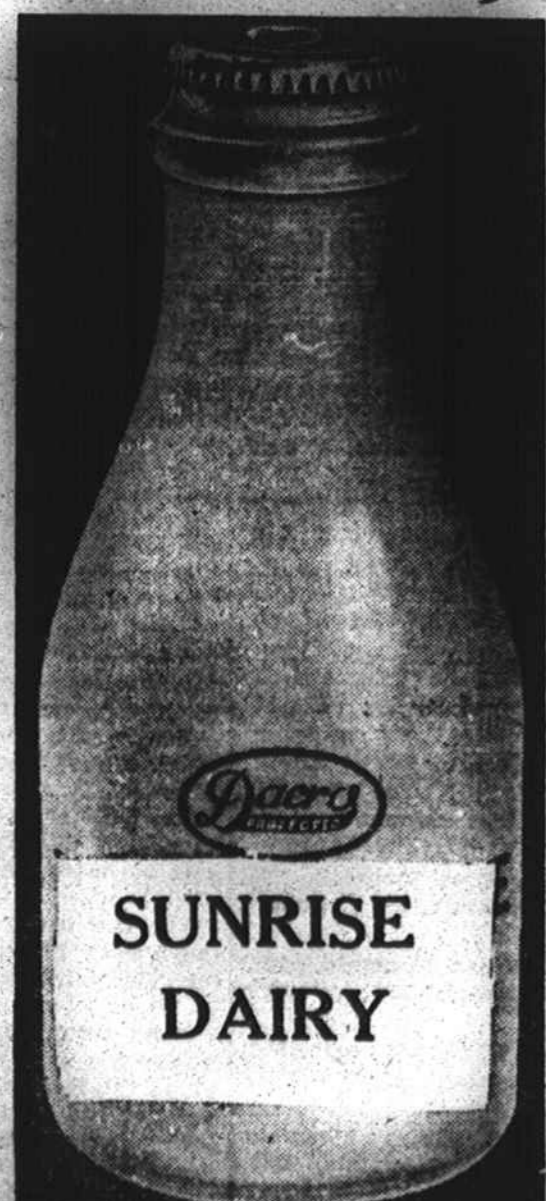
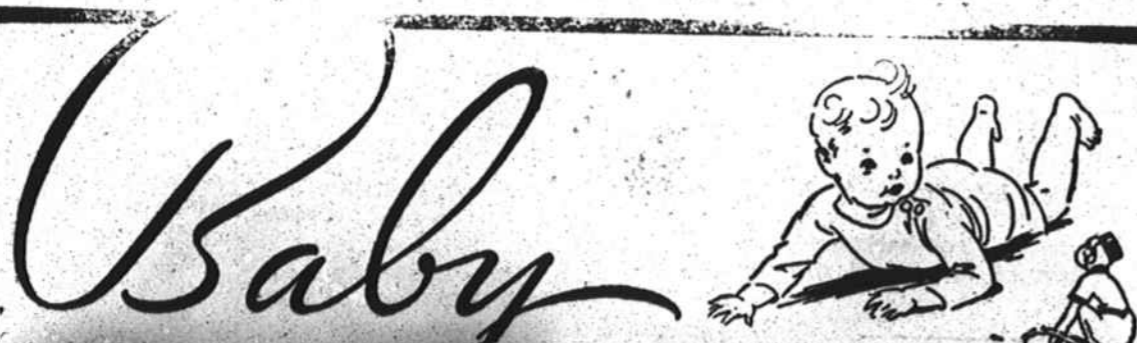
