Early Breeding May Injure Young Stock

Breeding young animals too soon will stunt their growth and lower the quality of their offspring, warns L. I. Case, extension animal husbandman at State College. Heifers should not be bred until they are at least 18 months old, and sometimes it is advisable to wait until they are 20 or 24 months old.

Case pointed out that the American Hereford Cattle Breeders Association will not register a calf dropped from a cow that is less than 27 months old, which means that the heifers must not be bred before they are 18 months old. He also stated that July and August are the best breeding months for commercial sheep flocks in North Carolina.

The ewes and their lambs, he continues, can make a good living in the winter by feeding on winter cover crops of rye or other small grains along with winter legumes such as crimson clover, Austrian winter peas, and vetch. The best breeding months for beef cattle are May, June, and July, so the calves will be dropped in February and March have them time to be ready for weaning about November 1.

Bulls and rams should be provided with small separate pastures with strong, tight fences that will keep the males away from the females except in the regular breeding season.
