

Mountaineers Take Harding High For Second Time 14-2

Captain Bill Smith Suffers Broken Arm.

Last Friday afternoon the Mountaineers defeated the Harding High team of Charlotte 14 to 2 for the second victory of the year over that team. Smith, Harding Captain, suffered a broken arm in the final period and several other Charlotte boys were also carried from the field during the game.

Kezziah, Mountaineer half, was the offensive star of the game, making two beautiful long runs, one of which gained approximately 30 yards and the other netting 45. Neisler was also outstanding in both offensive and defensive work. Bennett and Harper shared honors in the local's line. Conrad and Millen were Charlotte's line stars, with Stokes

and Pringle taking backfield honors. Charlotte's lone tally, a safety, came in the last period after Neisler had intercepted a Charlotte pass and broken up a scoring threat. The invaders were on the home team's ten yard stripe and were marching toward pay dirt when Neisler intercepted the pass. Passing was the most effective defensive attack the Harding boys could muster, and they completed several in the final period despite a stiff breeze.

Tomorrow the Mountaineers invade Forest City for that Town's Armistice Day celebration. The Forest City team is considered a fairly strong eleven by virtue of having held Newton to a tie, and the game should be a hot affair. The Mountaineers are out to prove that they can beat Forest City and have even themselves up for losing to Newton.

The Rutherford County folk have invited the Kings Mountain School Band to come up for the game and to take part in the celebration.

We urge each person to have just as much part in this work as he or she can, even with some sacrifice.
