"JUNIOR DAY" OF FEDERATION OF WOMAN'S CLUBS IN RALEIGH MONDAY APRIL 17

"Junior Day" of the 37th annual convention of the State Federation of Woman's Clubs, to be held in Raleigh, in April, will be Monday, April 17. Headquarters for the convention will be the Sir Walter Hotel.

The President's Breakfast in honor of Mrs. Howard G. Etheridge, State Federation President will be the first event on the Junior program. Only presidents of Junior Clubs and State Junior officers will attend the breakfast, which will begin at 8:15 o'clock.

The highlight of the morning session will be the address of Mrs. Sallie Orr Dunbar, General Federation President, who will arrive from Washington, D. C., Monday morning. The convention will be welcomed by Mrs. Patrick Hoey, Jr., president of the Junior Woman's Club of Raleigh. The program will be arranged by Miss Gerda Quetch, president of the Wilmington Junior Sorosis. The morning session will be held in the Colonial Room of the Sir Walter Hotel.

Mrs. Karl Bishopric of Spray, Junior chairman, will bring her message to Juniors at the morning session, which will be presided over by the president, Miss Nancy Cox of Raleigh. Following a short business session group conferences will be held, at which time the following topics will be discussed: Programs and publicity, Mrs. Henry Harris of Raleigh, chairman; parliamentary law, Mrs. A. W. Gholson of Hender-

son, ways and means of raising money, Mrs. Harry Bynum of Greensboro; point system and training school, Miss Maude Hutcherson of Winston-Salem; and State and local projects, Mrs. Robert Gatling of Ahoskie, Junior editor. Mrs. Clyde R. Hoey will be guest of honor and speaker at the luncheon at 1 o'clock in the Virginia Dare ballroom at the Sir Walter. Plans for Juniors at the General Federation convention in San Francisco, May 9-11 will be presented by Mrs. R. H. Latham of Asheville, chairman of the budget in the General Federation who also will be an honor guest. Mrs. Harry Bynum, president of the Greensboro Junior Club, will sing during the luncheon hour.

The afternoon business session will be presided over by Mrs. Karl Bishopric of Spray and will be featured by the election of officers and reports of leaders of the group conferences. Mrs. R. D. V. Jones will speak briefly on the Sallie Southall Cotton Loan Fund. A tea will be given Monday afternoon at 5 o'clock at the Woman's Club honoring Mrs. Bishopric and other officers, courtesy the Junior Woman's Club of Raleigh. All Junior delegates and visitors attending the convention will be guests of the Raleigh clubwomen.

The Juniors will join with the entire convention Monday evening to hear the addresses of Governor Hoey and of the National president, Mrs. Dunbar, who will be introduced by Mrs. Hoey.

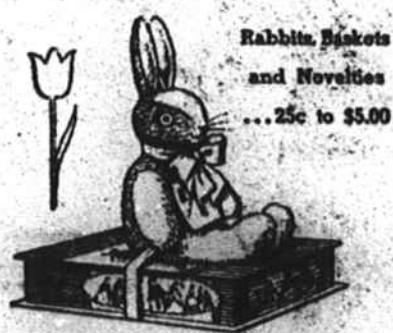

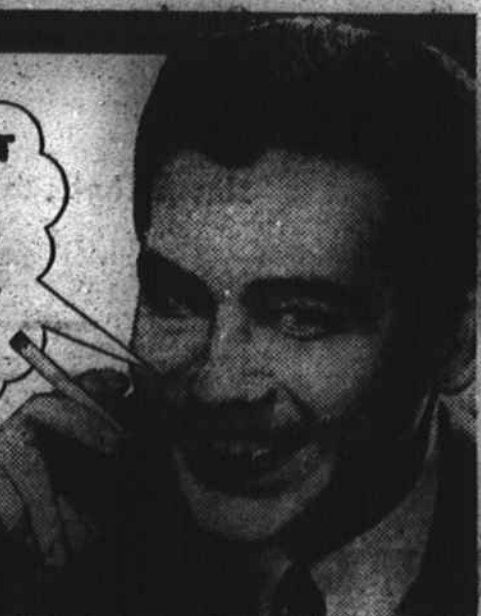
