Scores Juvenile Lure Of Totalitarian States

New York, May 8.—(IPS)—American youth will be saved from the "juvenile traits" of totalitarian politics because its traditions are based on "rational attitudes, sensible social relationships and Americanism."

Rev. John Water House declared here recently, emphasizing the important part that religion must play in achieving this end.

"Fascism, Nazism, Communism know what they want and go after it directly," he said. "These 'isms' know how to make their politics into a religion, and millions of men — young men — are ready to die for their beliefs in these 'isms'."

"Religion calls American youth to rational attitudes, sensible social relationships and Americanism based upon spiritual idealism. This call will last and America will be saved from the juvenile traits that represent totalitarian politics."

Pump Priming Theory Declared Ineffective

New York, May 8.—(IPS)—Federal "pump-priming" dollars have been only 64 percent effective in reaching the nation's spending channels according to the National Industrial Conference Board. The N. I. C. B.'s study covered five years of deficit spending from 1934-1938.

"The theory of pump-priming, upon which our fiscal policy has been based in recent years, is that the government borrows a large amount of money, spends it and thereby increases purchasing power," the announcement said. "Eventually, according to the theory, a higher return of taxes from the greater national income will pay the expenses of pump-priming."

"Actually in the five years the government increased the national debt by \$14,000,000,000. Instead of the vast increase in national income which the fiscal theorists expected, however, the gain in yearly income eliminating the effect of price changes, was only 9 billion dollars."

The U. S. Department of Agriculture estimates that American farmers received in March a cash income including benefit payments, of \$582,000,000, an increase of 13 per cent over February's estimated \$486,000,000.

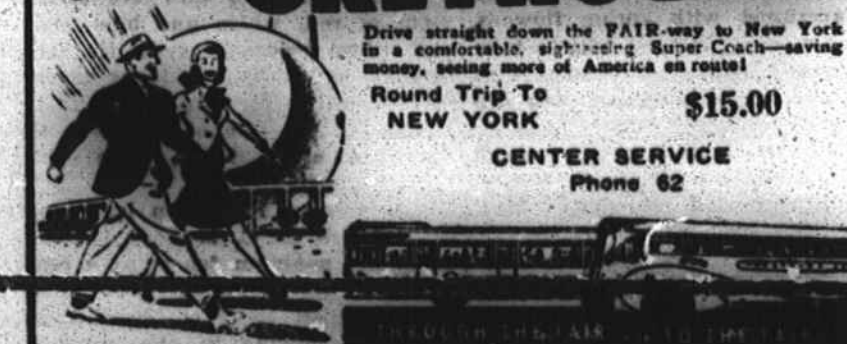
