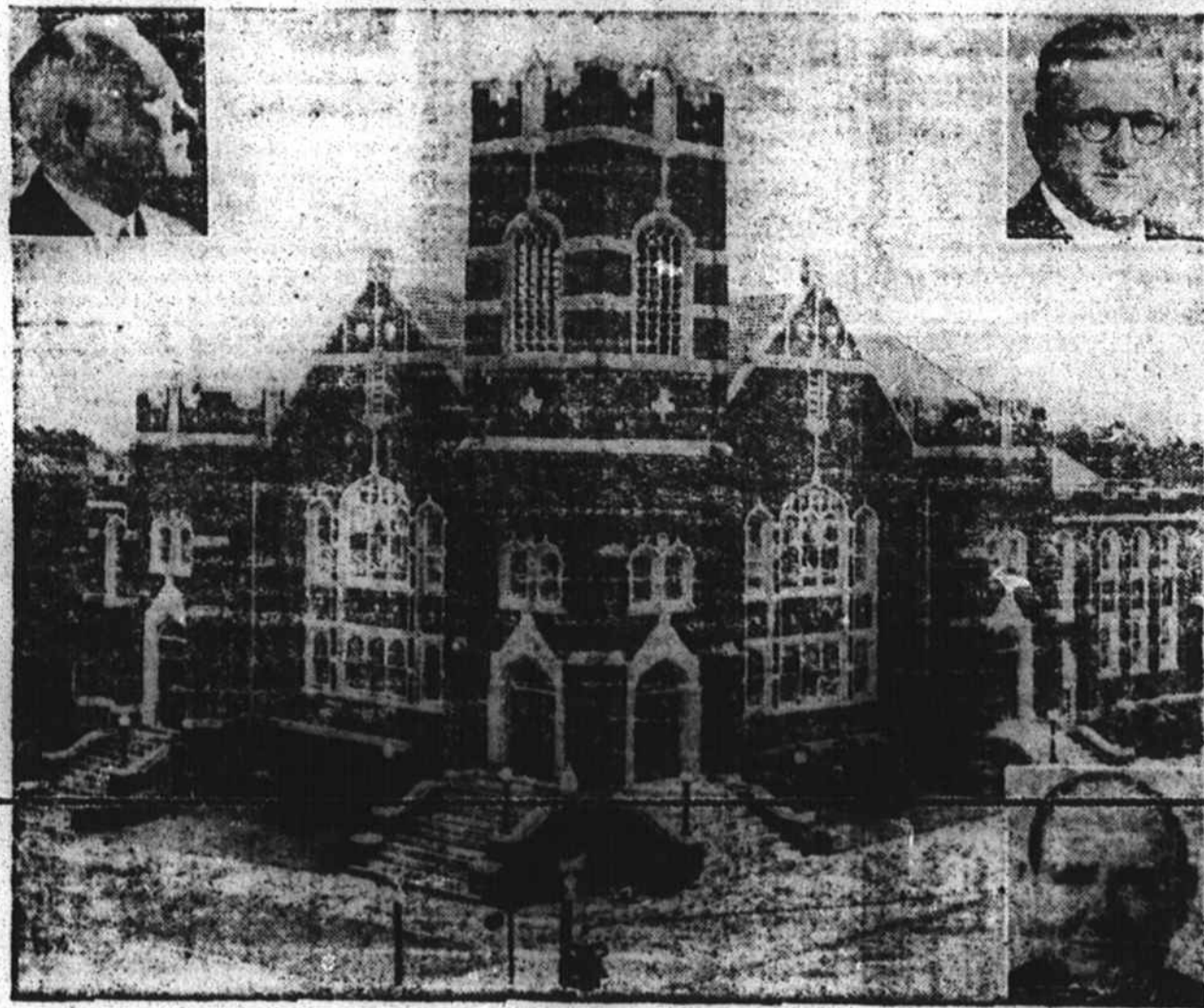


HANDSOME SHELBY CHURCH

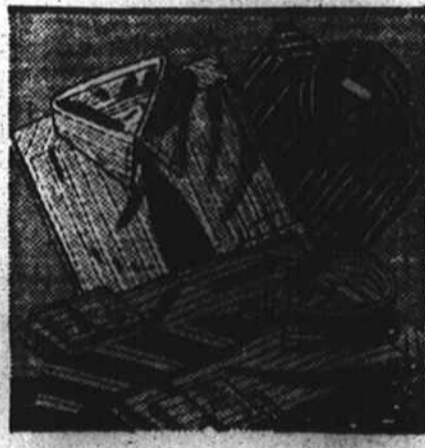

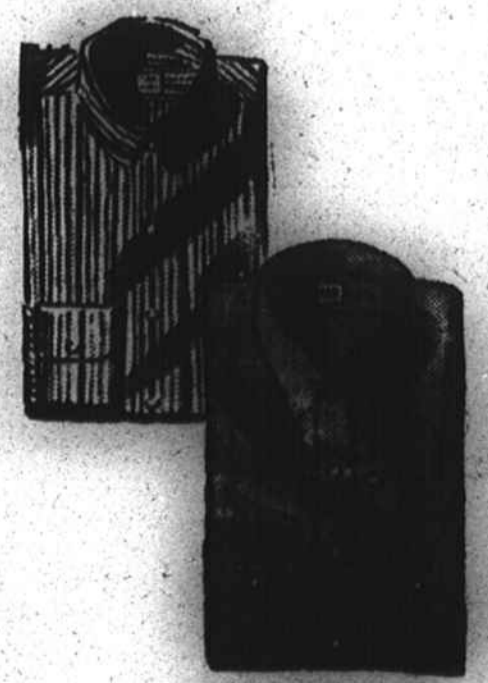
