### Farmers Grateful For Rubber Tire Invention

Des Moines, Iowa, Dec. 4.—(IPS).—Development by the rubber industry of the modern, low-profile tire has resulted in time and money savings for the farmer, a survey of Iowa farmers reveals.

Agricultural engineers of the Iowa Agricultural Experiment Station have recently completed a study of the use of rubber tires on the farm, and found the average farmer reporting a 23 percent saving in time and a 22 per cent saving in fuel by using rubber tires on his tractor. Farm operations in 73 counties in the State were studied by the engineers. They found the farmer reporting higher tractor speeds, easier operation on hard-surfaced roads, less damage to farm roads, lanes, meadows and pastures; decreased tractor breakage and wear, and greater comfort.
