12 Big News Stories Of 1939

NEW YORK.—Declaration of war on Germany by Great Britain and France on September 3 was the number one news story of 1939. In the opinion of more than 1,000 United Press client editors who voted on the "12 best stories" of the year in the final tabulation published last week the allied decision to wage war was mentioned in all but two ballots. One editor placed the partition of Poland at the head of the list; another the siege of Warsaw.

The Columbia Broadcasting system has announced that on New Year's eve it would carry over its network a dramatization of the big stories as selected by the United Press editors.

Here are the selections:

1. Declaration of war on Germany by Great Britain and France.
 2. Invasion and partition of Poland by Germany and Russia.
 3. The Russian invasion of Finland, including the bombing of Helsinki.
 4. The Russian-German non-aggression pact.
 5. Visit of King George and Queen Elizabeth to America.
 6. Death of Pope Pius XI and election of Pius XII.
 7. Submarine Squalls disaster, including loss of British and French submarines Thetis and Phoenix.
 8. Special neutralization session of congress.
 9. German annexation of Czechia and Slovakia.
 10. Sinking of the British liner Athenia.
 11. Munich beer hall blast.
 12. German capture of the City of Flint.
- The poll was conducted before the scuttling of the German pocket battleship Admiral Graf Spee, which almost certainly would have rated a high position.
