

Standard Training School At Central Methodist Church

A Standard Training School for Christian Workers will be held at Central Methodist Church beginning Monday, Jan. 15, at 7 p. m. Rev. W. A. Kale, pastor of Trinity Methodist Church, Kannapolis, N. C. will teach the course, "Christian Education in the Local Church."

The school will be held on Monday and Tuesday evenings each week for three weeks. Enrollment for credit is limited to those who are 16 years of age or over, but young people as well as church school officers, teachers, and workers, are

invited to enroll. Rev. H. C. Sprinkle, Jr., is manager of the school; B. S. Peeler, chairman of the Enrollment committee, and J. R. Davis, chairman of the finance committee.

Mr. Kale is a graduate of Duke and Yale universities, and was for several years Executive Secretary of the Western N. C. Conference Board of Christian Education. He is in constant demand as speaker and teacher in the field of church school work, and Kings Mountain Methodists are fortunate to secure his services.

PIONEER SAMUEL MAUNEY IS DEAD

CHERRYVILLE, Jan. 10.—Samuel S. Mauney, 88, retired businessman and textileist, and one of the pioneer residents of Cherryville, died Tuesday night at 8 o'clock after a long illness.

Funeral services will be held at Saint John's Lutheran church in Cherryville Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock, conducted by the pastor Rev. W. G. Cobb.

Mr. Mauney was the youngest and last surviving member of the well-known Mauney family, three sons

and a daughter, children of the late David and Fanny Mauney of Cherryville. A sister, Mrs. Mel L. Rudisill, died last October 18 at the age of 90 years. His two brothers, Jacob and Andrew Mauney, were prominent textile men of Kings Mountain. Their deaths occurred several years ago.
