

Junior College Alumni To Meet February 3rd

A called meeting of the Helling Springs College Alumni Association was announced today by Alumni President Kay E. Brown for 7:00 o'clock Saturday evening, February 3, in the college dining room.

Purpose of the gathering will be to complete plans for the J. D. Huggins Memorial building to be erected by the alumni association during an expansion program. The structure recently was approved after a five-year consideration as a suitable memorial to the late Professor Huggins, a founder of the school and for many years president of the institution.

As planned, the building would serve as a library and cost between \$3,000 and \$5,000, being built in conjunction with but in addition to the \$35,000 building program scheduled to get underway at the junior college this spring. The new library would be constructed of native stone and of sufficient size to take care of the needs of the school for

many years. Funds to cover expenses of the building are being raised by alumni contributions. President Brown asserted several hundred of the alumni already have been contacted mail pledge cards having been sent to all whose addresses are known. The response to date has been enthusiastic, he said, and those who find it impossible to attend the February 3 meeting are urged to mail in their pledges immediately so that construction can begin as soon as weather permits in the spring.

Mr. Brown commented that J. R. Cantrell, president of Helling Springs College, has been pushing the alumni drive in his contact work "and says that there is a deep desire on the part of the alumni to see the memory of Professor Huggins perpetuated."
