Parents Urged To Teach Children Safety Habits

RALEIG. — The fact that twenty-one children were killed on North Carolina streets and highways the first three months of this year is viewed by Ronald Hocutt, Director of the Highway Safety Division, as a stern challenge to everyone interested in safety, but particularly to North Carolina parents.

"Pending the fulfillment of our hope of having safety taught in every school in North Carolina, the responsibility for teaching our children safety habits must lie chiefly with their parents," said Hocutt.

The safety director pointed out that the 21 traffic fatalities under 15 years of age included nine who were crossing or playing in the street or roadway, one skater who skated in front of a car, one bicyclist who disregarded a stop sign, and one child on a sled.

"If parents expect their children to walk, play, skate and ride bicycles in a safe manner, they must take it upon themselves to impress their children with the importance of safe practices and the dangers of wrong practices," Hocutt said.

"If your child rides a bicycle, see that he or she learns safe cycling habits, preferably by joining a Bicycle Club, if there is one in your community; if your child owns skates, teach him not to skate in the street; and, above all, see that your child doesn't play in the street that he learns to look before crossing the street or road, and that he cultivates safe pedestrian habits.

"It is better that your child learn the lessons of safety through teaching, not through experience."

Infertile Eggs Keep Best In Summertime

Get rid of, or pen up the roosters and produce only "infertile" eggs, says C. F. Parrish, head of the Poultry Extension Office at N. C. State College, in his suggestions to poultry-raisers for the month of May.

"The male birds are of no use in the flock after hatching is completed, so sell them, eat them, or at least separate them from the hens," the specialist said.

He pointed out that infertile eggs keep much better than fertile eggs in the summertime. Gather the eggs often in wire baskets, especially in the broody hen season, and this will help to cool the eggs quickly. The

eggs should be left in the wire baskets overnight, before packing in cartons or cases for marketing.

Continuing his advice, Parrish said: "If a cool moist room is not available for holding the eggs until marketing time, construct an egg cooling rack. It consists of a frame work covered with burlap on one or more sides with provision being made for a water pan or can on top to keep the burlap curtain saturated with water. The evaporation keeps the eggs cool and moist."

As other suggestions for work in the poultry yard this month, the specialist said a soybean patch should be started now to provide green feed and shade for the pullets this spring and summer. It is better to plant the beans in rows.

Also, in many farm flocks there is more than normal mortality at this season of the year where dirt floor hen houses are used and filth is allowed to collect. Fowl typhoid and other diseases usually get a start under such conditions as these, Parrish declared.

Production of cattle in California declined about 3 percent in 1939 because of poor range and feed conditions, says the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

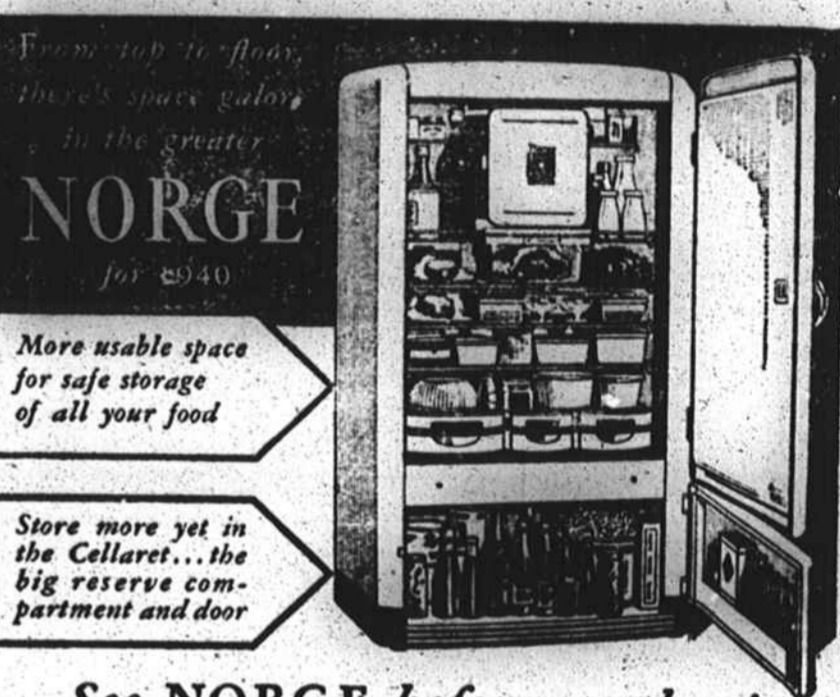
