> Dr. Scaub said that the National Farm Program has enabled farmers to become better organized and more ready to work together than at any time in history. He also poin ted out that, through the Agricultural Conservation Program. the fertility of the soil has been built up to where the necessities of war could be produced in greater quanti ties, with less time and expense,

> "Our Extension organization was only three years old when the United States entered the first World War in 1917," Dr. Schaub continued 'Yet, with limited personnel experience, the farm and agents and subject matter specialists provided efficient leadership in that great crisis. Farm and demonstration work is now years old, and we have an organization of trained agents, specialists and administrators. Every county in the State is organized for Extension work.

> 'Many of the farm and home gents, canning and clothing special ists, and others who directed emergency activities of rural people in 1917 and 1918, and again during the depression years, ade still with the organization. They did their jobs ef ficieintly then; they have the conft dence of the farm people, and are ready to lead again.
