Ample Care Urged For Pullet Flock
Poultrymen caring for their pullet flock during the late summer and fall should keep in mind that a little neglect now may be costly later.

The good poultryman will see that his birds are well fed on growing mash, whole corn, whole oats, and green feed. Here's why these items are so important in the pullet's diet:

For late summer grazing and green feed, sowed young green corn may be used to good advantage, along with Sudan grass, wheat, oats, barley, soybeans, and alfalfa. If ample grazing has not already been provided, a green feed crop should be planted now.

Revival Begins Sunday At Oakview Church

A revival will begin Sunday, August 11th, at Oakview Baptist Church with a picnic dinner to be served on the grounds at noon.

Following a home water system meeting conducted by H. M. Ellis, extension agricultural engineer of State College, nine Duplin County women and nine men indicated plans to improve their systems.

Much improvement was made this year in the handling, packaging, and shipping to market of Pamlico County's Irish potato crop, reports Farm Agent A. T. Jackson.

Increases in wage rates paid per month and per day to hired farm labor, both with and without board, were reported in all sections of the country except the East South Central States.

Slaughter supplies of hogs substantially smaller than in the current marketing year are indicated for the 1940-41 marketing year beginning October 1, reports the U. S. Bureau of Agricultural Economics.

The harvest of commercial and market garden vegetable crops continues to move northward, and heavier supplies of fresh vegetables are coming into the large consuming centers from nearby areas.

The Cotton Textile Institute will undertake immediately a nationwide campaign to increase American cotton consumption by 25 percent over its record peak.

Outstanding improvements about the farm and home are being reported by Watauga County growers who joined the demonstration farm program in 1935, says Assistant Farm Agent G. G. Farthing.

Community planning meetings in relation to the Land Use Planning program have been held in all five communities of Transylvania County, reports J. A. Glazener, farm agent.

The cotton acreage in cultivation in the United States as of July 1 totaled 25,077,000, according to the preliminary estimate issued by the U. S. Agricultural Marketing Service.

It has been found that goldfish will control mosquito "wrigglers" in ponds and pools a little better if the fish are allowed to go hungry.

Alfalfa, good as it is, could be much better and plant breeders of the College Experiment Stations and the U. S. Department of Agriculture, are at work seeking to improve on the existing varieties.
