

Safety Car Coming To Local High School

The actual distance required to stop an automobile travelling at various speeds will be graphically demonstrated for the students of Kings Mountain High School and for interested townspeople as well, at 10:30 A. M. on Nov. 5th, on Parker street. It has been announced by R. N. Barnes, Superintendent.

The demonstration will be made by Harry M. Poutous, Safety Director, and Earl Burrell, Insurance Companies, with a special equipped automobile. Yellow bullets fired from revolvers mounted on the front bumper of the car graphically show how much time various drivers require to place their feet on the brake pedal and how far the car travels before coming to a full stop.

This program is being brought to Kings Mountain through the courtesy of Mr. A. Rhyno, local representative of the company.

Students, teachers and traffic officers will do the actual driving for the tests. A group of students will do the measuring and the recording of the results.

A demonstration of correct and incorrect ways of turning a car around will also be given by Mr. Poutous.

The public is cordially invited to attend both the lecture and the outside demonstration.

Winners Score Early.
 The local team made its first touchdown early in the first period when a bad pass from center went over the goal line and recovered by Moss. The try for the extra point failed. The second score was made by Gibson just before the half on a 12 yard line plunge.

Band Drills
