N. C. Leads In Diphtheria Cases Reported

Raleigh.—North Carolina has reported another "first," this one termed a "disgraceful first" by Dr. Carl V. Reynolds, State Health Officer who announced that this State continues to lead the nation in the number of diphtheria cases reported.

In the statement for the week ending Dec. 21, furnished health officers by the U. S. Public Health Service, Dr. Reynolds pointed out, North Carolina was accredited with 28 cases of diphtheria, "that communicable, dangerous, preventable and inexcusable disease, an escape from which was made available by the Legislature in 1939, when it passed a law requiring immunization of all children during the first year of life, and as a requisite for entrance
