**Mountaineers Win Two More**

**Kings Mountain Downs Cherryville**

Coach A. E. Smart's Mountaineers journeyed to Cherryville last Monday to battle Coach Jack Kiser's nine and stayed long enough to bring back to Kings Mountain a 4 to 1 victory which made the third straight game appear on the record in the Western Conference. This victory was the first secured by a Kings Mountain team on Cherryville's ground in several years. Ballard and Beam engaged in a nip and tuck pitching duel with such skill that only five hits were collected for both teams. Kings Mountain

The Kings Mountain team fielded perfect ball on the few chances they had while Cherryville made 7 errors. In the third inning George Womack scored on Jimmie Willis' single to make up the first run, and in the seventh Kings Mountain made three more on three errors. Carpenter tallied the only Cherryville run in the ninth inning by smacking the ball over first base which continued to roll for a home run.

Ware and Willis connected for one each for the Mountaineers to lead the attack. Beam obtained 2 for 4 and Carpenter 1 for 4 for Cherryville.

**Mountaineers Subdue Lincolnton 16-3**

The Kings Mountain Baseball nine won their fourth consecutive game Tuesday by defeating Lincolnton 16 to 3. Lincolnton's pitching was very weak, giving up eight passed bases and 13 hits to the Mountaineers.

John George and Cobb handled the mound duties for the locals. George allowing only 3 hits in seven innings and walking only two men; while Cobb gave up two hits in two innings. Both boys looked good on the mound.
