

#### Three Steps Necessary To Revive 'Stick' Trees

Home owners throughout North Carolina have trees in their lawns or elsewhere that have a sickly appearance. They may be dying back at the top, or sparsely leafed. They wonder what is the trouble.

R. W. Graeber, Extension forester. of N. C. State College, says "sick" shade trees usually need fertilizer, water and a protective leaf mulch. He suggests:

1. A first-year fertilizer treatment of cotton seed meal, sulphate of am monia and bone meal, applied on soaked ground or watered-in well after the application. In succeeding years the fertilizer treatfent should be mostly sulphate of ammonia.

2. Water the trees regularly during the growing season - from early spring to mid-summer. Watering the surface is not enough, in fact it is useless and wasteful. Enough water should be applied to wet the soil thoroughly for a foot in depth. Allowing a small stream to run all hight and changing the location on successive nights is an excellent method

3. Restore Nature's protective distance of at least two-thirds, of depression low. the branched-spread of the tree. To

Washington observers, who have had the need for defense speed dinned in their ears constantly for the past few months, and who have had a good chance to watch the immense progress that has been made so far, feel pretty sure that any additional step-up in the program can only be achieved by men of the ype now on the job.

Here is a little bit of history on this subject:

When our federal government began to "buy defense" on a large cale last June, it was putting the ents, in business for itself in a big way. For the defense program was a kind of super-super enterprise that could only succeed if it were run along sound business lines of planning, coordinating, , spending where it would do the most good, ost in the history of the organizaand producing the best possible finished product.

It was only natural, then, that business men should be put in char ge of defense production and raw materials purchases and various other phases of this big industrial job. The presence of Messrs Knud-sen and Stettinius and Piggers and their compatriots gave the general public confidence and rightly so. These men were not primarily inter ested in performing interesting statistical tricks; they liked to sec products rolling off the end of a well. synchronized assembly line. That was what the American people wan ted to see, too,

Today, the public is getting what it, wants in the form of an astonisning record of accomplishment. The full figures aren't available, of course, but even the scattered ones we have indicate clearly that defense progress has been remarkable, in the tradition of private American manufacturing achievements. Statisticians tell us that in nine months we have made more progress, working together as free men, than the Nazis did in two and a half years with their much-vaunted government-dictated economy.

American industry has already completed more than 3 billion ot the first 12 billion of defense goods ordered. Productive faculties of American aircraft factories increased 28 percent in the 59 days ending March 1. We are well on our way towards employing one million men in aircraft production.


