

The brightet spot in the whole traffic accident picture for 1940, in fact, was the large reduction shown in fatalities and injuries from mo tor vehicle-bicycle collisions. Last year, 20 bicycle riders were killed and 208 were injured in accidents in this state, whereas 37 were killed and 258 injured in 1939. This was nearly a 50 percent reduction in bicycle fatalities, and the decrease was particularly noteworthy in view of the increased uso of bicycles and the upward trend of all other, types of fraffic accidents.

"inasmuch as a great majority of he bicycles are in citles and towns, we feel that an hopertant factor be hind this decrease in bicycle fatal tles has been the fact that many nunicipalities in the state have a dopted ordinances designed to reg ulate and control bicycle riders, said Ronald Heentt, director of the safety divisiion "Fourteen' cities in the state have compulsory registra estate: 5 tion of bicycles, regulatory ordi

nances, or both, and these hav, formed the basis for an educational and enforcement program amorg bicycle riders in these municipali-

"I am' certain that if this program is consistently carried on and, expanded, the hazards created by bicycle traffic will be greatly reduced,' he said.
