

## Navy Ads Help

RALEIGH, Nov. 20.—At least one fourth of the 600 men recruited for the Navy in North and South Carolina during October were influenced by the current Navy advertising campaign being conducted in the two states, Lt. Commander McFarland W. Wood, officer in charge of recruiting in the Carolinas, announced today.

Records reveal that at least one-fourth of Ordnance, legal documents—the largest number taken in one month since World War I—joined the Navy as a result of the advertising campaign, while many other recruits reported that the ads had helped them decide to join A service's "First Line of Defense."

### "Tom Sawyer" Coming In Big Puppet Show

Young Victor Charles thereby has a long tradition of the theater behind him and absorbed at an early age much of the background and feeling for it that has enabled him to come to the fore in his own chosen field of the marionette theatre. His company of three are all experienced puppeteers, and give to their work the energy and zest which only a real love for the theater can command.

## Britain Needs Food, Extension Folks Tell

"Every last kind of food that the United States sends to Great Britain reduces the time that will elapse before the democracies of the world triumph over Hitlerish-Paul H. Appelby, undersecretary of agriculture in Washington, told 400 Extension Service workers in convention at State College in Pennsylvania this week.

Appelby was one of the principal speakers at the conference of all county farm and home agents, agricultural agents and Extension specialists who gave a report on his recent trip to England as a representative of the U. S. Department of Agriculture upon the invitation of the British government.

The United States now sends well over 100,000 tons of food to the British people, or about 10 million pounds, each month and through out 1942, Appelby declared. Food is extremely scarce in England, but our ships are reaching the mother country of the people and conditions are constantly improving by contrast.

The government official said that he has eight pounds and his companion on the trip, A. M. Evans, National AAA administrator, lost 10 pounds during the four weeks they were in England and the two weeks they spent in Portugal. He said they each had only one egg to eat in four weeks and so no time did they have milk to drink.

Appelby told the Extension workers that they have a big job to do in seeing that the nationwide "Food for Freedom" campaign to increase food production in North Carolina needs to increase its egg production by 13 percent.
