

Safety Assured for Tiny Tourists



Tiny tourists sometimes grow restless on long motor trips and their limited energy and curiosity require swift checking to insure that every safety precaution is being taken by their parents. With the entire car compartment of the family Chevrolet as his personal playground, this youngster assumes a favorite perch that ordinarily would be dangerous. However, a simple adjustment, easily made by Chevrolet mechanics, converted the car door handle to a safety-action handle, which "free wheels" and does not open the door. After the lock is adjusted to safety position, as indicated in the inset, the lock button is depressed and the inside handle then will not open the door, rendering it "child-proof." Release of the lock button enables the driver to open the door as usual.
