

Bus And Truck Owners Urged To Fill Out Inventory Cards and Mail Now

Raleigh, Dec. 22.—State of the United States into war against the Axis Powers makes it more imperative than ever that truck and bus owners in North Carolina complete and return the inventory cards requested of them in November by the State Highway Traffic Advisory Committee to the War Department. W. Vance Duke, chairman, said today.

In order to get an inventory of all trucks, freight trailers and buses for use in operating highway transportation to meet war time needs efficiently, it is necessary that these facilities be inventoried by the State of North Carolina. The inventory cards are being distributed to the owners of all trucks, freight trailers, and military supplies, and in emergency, the movement of passenger traffic.

Another reason stressing the importance of this inventory, the chairman added, is it will help form a basis for priority ratings that will assure future production of new cars and trucks and replacement parts for existing equipment.

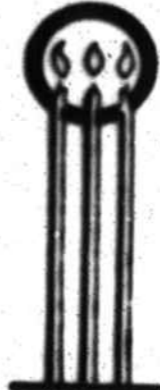

Local Boy Chosen For Navy

Norfolk, Va., Dec. 22.—James Harold Flook, of Kings Mountain, N. C., who recently enlisted in the United States Navy, has been chosen as one of the apprentice seamen qualified to study at a Navy Service School. He will be given sixteen weeks of intensive instruction which will prepare him for special service in the Navy. This training will provide him with a trade, if he ever desires to return to civilian life.

Flook enlisted in the Navy at the Recruiting Station in Charlotte. He has just completed his recruit training at the Norfolk Naval Training Station and will enter the Diesel School at Chicago. This is one of more than twenty schools open to recruits in which the Navy trains the best of its enlisted personnel. Among the courses offered are those for machinists' mates, metalmiths, carpenters' mates, radiomen, pharmacists' mates and electricians' mates—as well as an opportunity to study for entrance into the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis.
