The Mountaineers had a close call in the second half when Tri-High was about to overtake their lead, but they held their lead and won the game 15 to 10.

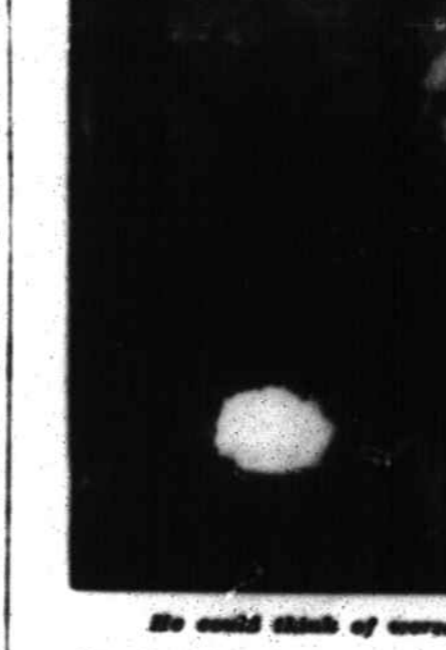
On Thursday night of this week, the local teams play Bessemer City on the Bessemer City court.
