registers of deeds for recording rate be made to the register of deeds of the county in which the applicant was born and not to the State Board of Health. If all applications shall be filed in the board of health records, the board would advise the applicant and would issue the certificate. A delay in the issuance of the certificate would be the applicant's fault. In October 1942, please bear this date in mind if the applicant needs a registration as to what proof is necessary. The register of deeds in each instance will supply the applicant with a list of the necessary and furnishes it. The register of deeds will see the certificate through. The only fees necessary are those prescribed by law to be paid. —Buy Defense Stamp! Buy Bonds!
